

# A lifetime of learning the Art of Mark Prosser



After 20 yrs of painting as a hobby, chasing a dream and making tonnes of mistakes, Mark Prosser thinks he finally learnt a few things.

"I've been an artist for as long as i can remember. Growing up in Thompson, Manitoba I drew all the time but after high school art was definitely not a career choice. I moved to Vancouver when I was 24 and started painting a couple years later. For the last 10 years I only did a few paintings every year for friends but didnt ever paint for myself. I forgot that I simply loved to paint and create.

In May of 2020 my wife Richelle made me buy a set of 5 canvases just for me.. It was the first time I painted for fun in so long and the outcome was beyond anything I expected. I challenged myself to do 5 animal paintings in 5 days and did it. I then posted them and to my absolute shock i sold 3 of them the next week. The pandemic gave me clarity and having the world pause made me realize what i was missing so i decided it was now or never to chase my dream full time. I knew everyone was at home and this was my opportunity.

I had become so focused on the destination that I actually forgot the journey. Instead of agonizing over every last detail and trying to polish each painting to perfection like a diamond I'm letting my creativity flow free and doing and not overthinking.

I used to second guess everything but now I don't assume or judge anything and let the painting come to it own life, its let loose a tsunami of creative energy that i just can't and won't control."



# Let's Celebrate Italian Heritage Month A festival of food, culture and life!

Every year the Government of Canada designates and dedicates the month of June to celebrating Italian Heritage month. June is also recognized internationally as Pride month, at which time the LGBTQ-2SIA+ community is honoured. This year the Italian Cultural Centre is celebrating both simultaneously. In support of these concurrent events the ICC is hosting two art and literary events.

First, the exhibition: *They, They,* & *It: Reflections on Trans Identity* continues its run throughout Italian Heritage Month. The show features new work by two trans artists Shel Stefan and Mickey Vescera who thoughtfully explore notions of gender, personal identity and personal safety.

Second, the Museum is hosting the launch of its Canada- wide Italian Canadian Queer Anthology: Here and Now. This publication features the experiential writings of over 50 queer Italian Canadian authors. It was edited by Licia Canton from Montreal who will be present for the event. There will also be many authors, especially the BC contingent of writers, who will be on hand on June 20 at 7 to offer readings from this Italian community landmark publication. There will also be refreshments available afterwards. Both the book launch and the exhibition are free.

In addition to the celebration of the queer community other planned events will take place showcasing all aspects of traditional Italian heritage. This includes: food, wine, music, literature, art, comedy, and cars!

To initiate Italian heritage month *Festa della Repubblica* opens the month-long celebrations at 7-9:30 pm on June 3, 2024. The evening features musical entertainment with speeches from local dignitaries. To follow up on June 6 at 7pm is *Books and Biscotti*, an evening devoted readings from members of the Italian

Canadian Writers Association. For automotive enthusiasts there is the *Classic Italian Auto Show* on June 16 at 11 am. All events are free and located at the Italian Cultural Centre.

Other events such as the *Day on The Drive* take place on Commercial drive on June 9. Included will be a youth talent show which will take place at the event main state.

Finally, there are many more events planned which can be attended for only a nominal fee, such as the launch of the World War II movie *Gino: Child of War* taking place on



June 2 (7-10 pm) for \$16.00. It tells the story of a young Italian boy Gino who is befriended by Canadian Soldiers when his hometown Torrice, Italy is liberated in 1944. Finally, there is a performance by Italian comedian *Terra Cannistraci* who will be at Il Centro on June 22. The cost is \$54.58.

Have you ever imagined what Kingsway looked like 130 years ago? The early settlers in the Collingwood area worked hard on their land before adding a cabin, chicken house, barn and well. They had to get rid of the tall fir trees which had been here for thousands of years. The photo shows one of the first settlers in this area. John Connon is working on a gigantic stump on his property. He immigrated from Scotland in 1889 when he was 60.

The stump pictured was one of many on John's 7.9 acres of land, where Subway is currently situated at 3490 Kingsway. John appears to be wearing a kilt while chopping the stump! He was 64 but interested in clearing out land in the Collingwood wilderness, even though he owned a



Youth Soccer Festival will be on Saturday, August 17, 2024 from 5 pm to 9 pm. The event takes place in partnership with the Collingwood



# Vancouver Celebrity Animals

Many people enjoy seeing or hearing about animals on the news. It is always interesting to hear about unusual animals like killer whales or sea lions instead of dogs and cats. People who live in British Columbia love saving wild animals when the animals are in danger. Two famous animals in the news lately were a killer whale named Brave Little Hunter, and a sea lion named Emmerson. Brave Little Hunter got stuck in a lagoon after its mother died and could not find its way back to the ocean. Rescuers tried lifting the killer whale onto a truck to move it but that didn't work. Another plan was to lift the whale out of the water with a plane. After a month, Brave Little Hunter found its own way out, swimming over a large hill of sand into the ocean. People who had been giving the whale food were very happy to see it swim free.

Emmerson the sea lion prefers to hang around people. This noisy animal attracted many tourists when it decided to make a beach in Victoria its home. When people started feeding Emmerson and taking selfies with him, environmentalists decided it was safer to relocate Emmerson to a remote beach where he could live undisturbed by people. Everyone was amazed when Emmerson swam back to the Victoria beach five days later. Four more attempts have been made to move Emmerson but he always returns. Emmerson has crossed streets, climbed stairs and walked through public gardens in Victoria.

These stories of celebrity wild animals are popular in BC because of the mountains and oceans that surround us. People in BC don't just enjoy looking at wild animals; they take pride in creating sanctuaries for them. There are several organizations dedicated to caring for and rescuing wild animals. Watching a wild animal return to their natural habitat is amazing. The Vancouver Aquarium rescues injured sea lions and other ocean mammals, heals their injuries and releases them into the wild again. This is a great way to respect the natural environment around us.






