# Soccer Forever: A Celebration of Collectors, Community and Il Centro

Featuring the Collection of Randy Rinaldo

from the Italian Cultural Centre

**With the arrival of FIFA World Cup 2026 in Vancouver, it is a time of reflection and awe.**

During the summer months June and July, the City of Vancouver will be taken over with this athletic celebration. However, its impact will be felt most deeply in the Italian community. Like blood in our veins, the impact of soccer courses through the Italian community DNA indelibly shaping its culture.

At the Italian Cultural Centre on May 28th at 7 pm we unveil our exhibition *Soccer Forever*. This exhibition reveals that soccer isn't just a game to the Italian community, but it is a way of life. The significance of the sport reverberates throughout the community culture and its daily rituals. Whether it is collecting memorabilia which serves as tangible milestones of our lives, these objects are steeped with such significance that only saints' relics can only rival their importance. Not to mention the memories of the hours spent at Callister field after Sunday Mass.

Finally, the game evokes the presence of cousins, uncles, and friends, many who are no longer with us, but who played the game at esteemed levels in the East Vancouver Columbus soccer club. The story of soccer in the Vancouver Italian community is not only about cultural connections to Italy, but it goes deeper. Soccer, was and continues to be, a guiding and substantial anchor to the past. The game of soccer in this exhibition is celebrated as a unifying force of vital importance, one which enabled a strong immigrant community to effectively plant their Italian roots into Canadian soil, and this important chapter of our history was played out...on the soccer field.

Cafu is an absolute titan of international football, holding records that may never be broken: **The World Cup Final Record:** He is the only player in football history to play in three consecutive FIFA World Cup Finals (1994, 1998, and 2002). **Two-Time World Cup Winner:** He won the trophy twice. First in 1994 (USA) as a substitute in the final, and later captaining the legendary 2002 squad. **Brazil's Most-Capped Player:** He represented the Brazilian national team (Seleção) 142 times between 1990 and 2006. During his peak years playing in Italy's top-tier league (Serie A), Italian fans nicknamed him *Il Pendolino* after the country's high-speed tilting trains. **The Style:** He revolutionized the right-back position. Instead of just staying back to defend, he possessed **boundless energy, sprinting up and down the right flank to act as an extra attacker.** **The Trademark Smile:** Remarkably, even when sprinting at full speed or under intense defensive pressure, Cafu almost always played with a massive, joyful smile on his face.

A photo from 1974 showing 5098 Joyce Street from the Vancouver Archives CVA 1095-04417.

It's difficult to believe that this is what Joyce street at Vanness looked like 52 years ago. This area will change even more in the next 20 years. I've written in detail about this old building in a past article (Feb 2018), but I recently discovered this photo in the Vancouver archives, so I had to share it here.

Looking to the right of the building you can see Central Park in Burnaby quite clearly. There were no warehouses, no apartment condos, and no Skytrain. The photo was taken in 1974.

If you enlarge the photo, you can see old buildings reflected in the bottom window. One is a furniture store, which sells and buys used furniture. One is a small old house. I remember there used to be a convenience store to the left of the furniture store. The name was *Lucky Dollar Store*. I shopped at it as late

as 1988. I've never found a photo of it, but I did find a few ads in the Vancouver Sun dated 1964. If anyone reading this has a photo of the Lucky Dollar store, I would love to see it.

# The 2400 Motel Re-development Can we not save more than just the sign?

Now celebrating 80 years, the beloved 2400 Motel on Kingsway is far more than just another old building slated for redevelopment. Built in 1946 during the golden age of post-war automobile travel, the 2400 remains one of the last surviving “auto-court” motels in Metro Vancouver and a rare surviving example of Streamline Moderne roadside architecture.

For decades, travelers arriving along Kingsway experienced the 2400 as one of Vancouver’s first welcoming gateways into the city. Unlike modern hotel towers, the motel’s unique layout featured individual bungalow-style cottages spread across landscaped green space, allowing guests to park directly outside their rooms — a hallmark of the era’s growing car culture.

Over the years, the 2400 Motel quietly became part of Vancouver’s cultural fabric. The property has appeared in countless television shows and films, including *The X-Files*, *Supernatural*, *Bates Motel*, and *Yellowjackets*. In 1966, members of the Grateful Dead (including Owsley: ) stayed there while performing in Vancouver, adding another chapter to the motel’s rich and unusual history.

Beyond film and music history, the site has also served practical community purposes over the decades, housing travelers, displaced families, refugees, and others in need of temporary shelter.

Many local residents and heritage advocates hope that redevelopment of the property can strike a balance between adding much-needed housing while still preserving key elements of this historic landmark.

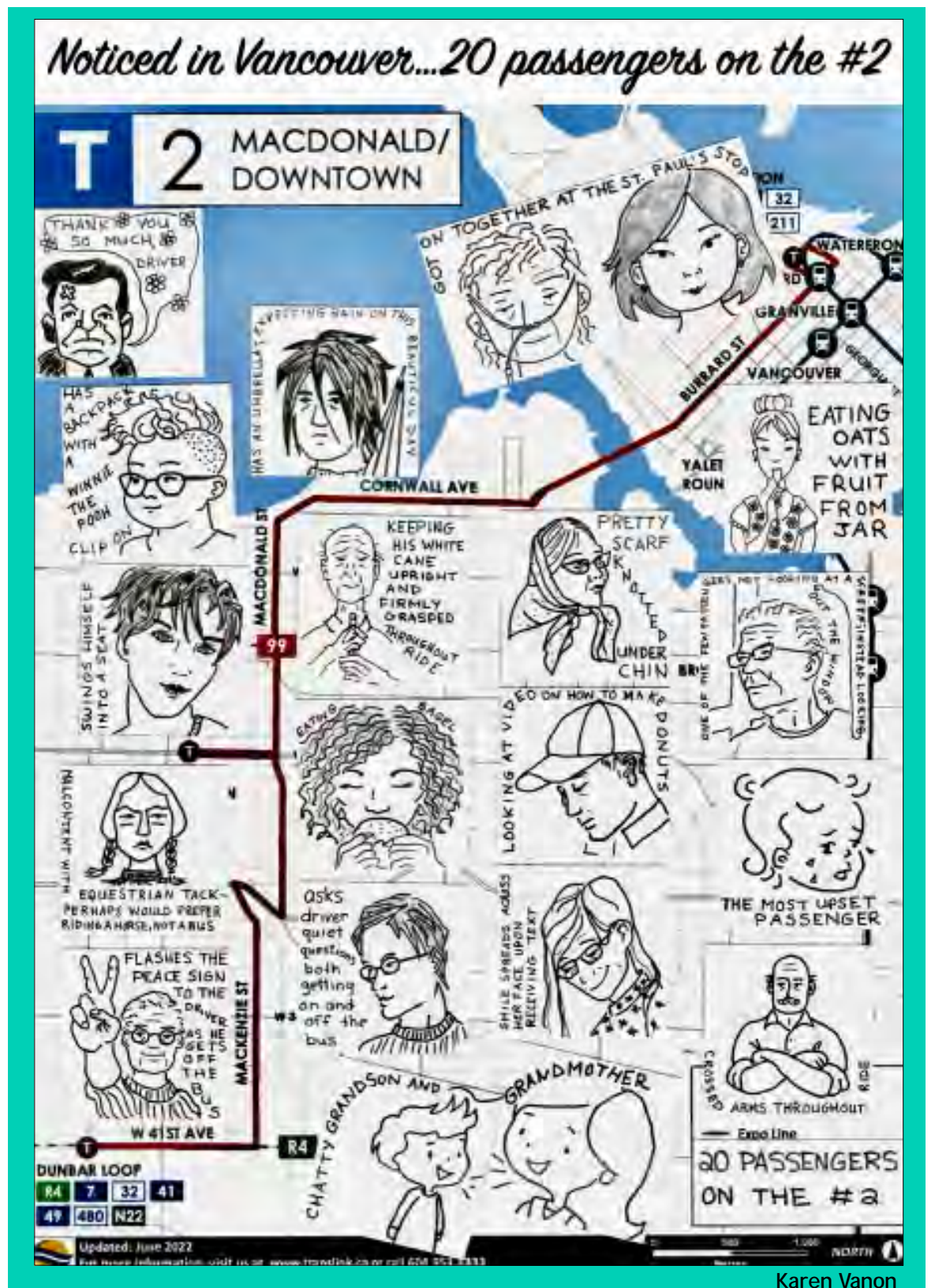
Currently, redevelopment concepts for the property largely focus on preserving the motel’s iconic neon sign while replacing the rest of the site with new housing towers and open courtyard space. However, some residents believe there may be an opportunity to go further by creatively incorporating portions of the original motel buildings into the new design itself. Existing bungalows and structures could potentially be repurposed into small community shops, cafés, galleries, or even a modest local history museum celebrating the site’s unique connection to Vancouver’s cultural and architectural past. Combined with a public remembrance garden, such ideas could help preserve not just the sign, but the spirit and physical character of the 2400 itself.

As Vancouver continues to evolve at a rapid pace, the fate of the 2400 Motel raises an important question: how do we continue building for the future while still preserving the stories, places, and character that helped shape our communities in the first place?

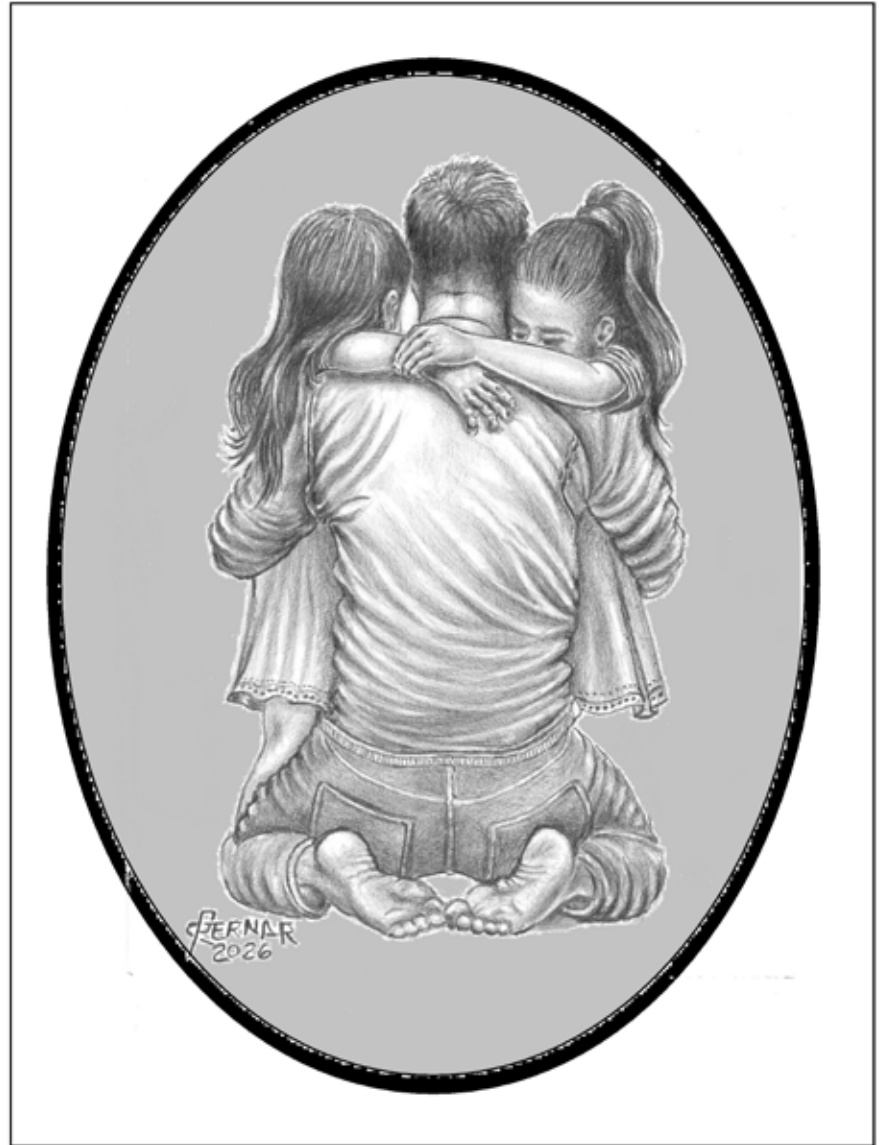

### Natural Dye Workshop: Dye a T-Shirt with Weeds

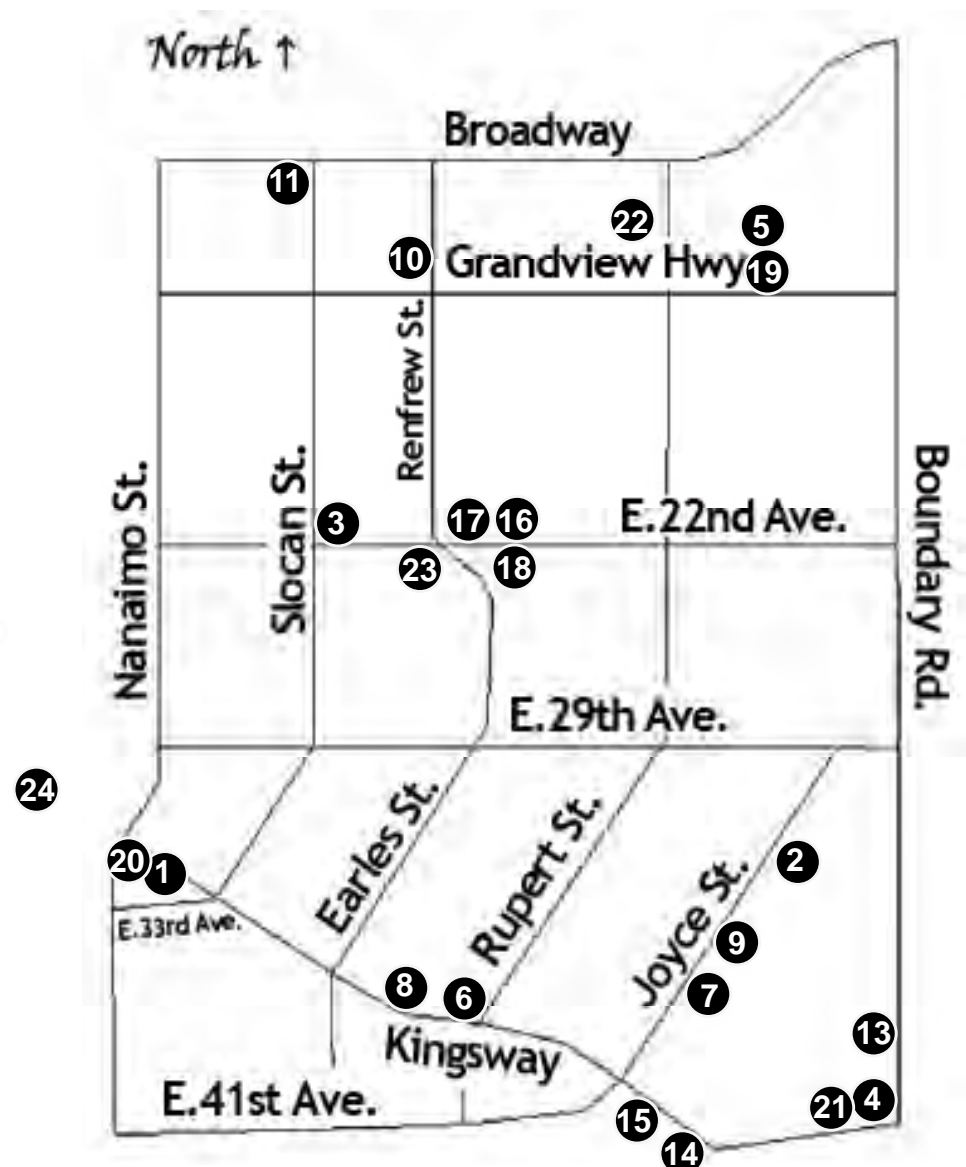
